Sunday Gospel thoughts

Sunday June 17th, 2018 3rd Sunday after Trinity (Mark 4.26-34)

I've shared with a few groups over the last while a story of how when I was a student I spent several weeks nurturing a house-plant in the home I shared with 2 friends. I was quite pleased with how the plant was doing, when I discovered that it was in fact a plastic plant! Oh dear. Parables of planting and growing are so common in Jesus' teaching that we can easily miss their richness (not seeing the proverbial wood for the trees!). These two parables are specifically about the Kingdom of God: the seed grows mysteriously (human intervention doesn't seem to matter much), and a tiny mustard seed is contrasted with the enormous tree it grows into. One commentator suggests that the point is that although the consummation of the Kingdom lies in the future, in a sense it is already happening and present now. Mark's own community would have taken encouragement that although they may have felt helpless, God was still at work.

What does it mean for God's Kingdom to be already present? How and where do you experience signs of that in your own community and in your daily life?

Sunday June 24th , 2018 4th Sunday after Trinity (Mark 4.35-end)

My friend and former colleague Nick King (translator of the Bible) calls this passage 'a remarkable story.' As it often the case, a storm arises on the Sea of Galilee, and the disciples panic (note that Mark doesn't portray the disciples in a particularly favourable light). Jesus tells the waves to behave (and it does) and then tells off the disciples indicating for the first time that faith matters. Their response is to 'fear a great fear', and acknowledgment that God is present. The question is then asked: 'Who is this then?' Mark doesn't answer, he leaves it up to us!
